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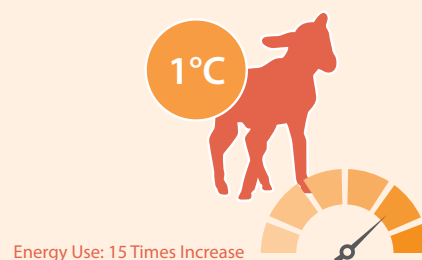
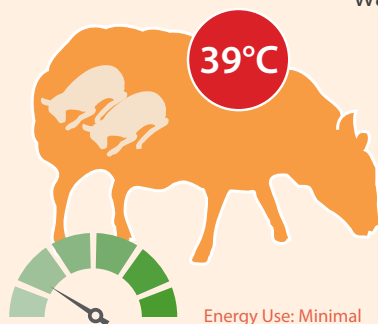

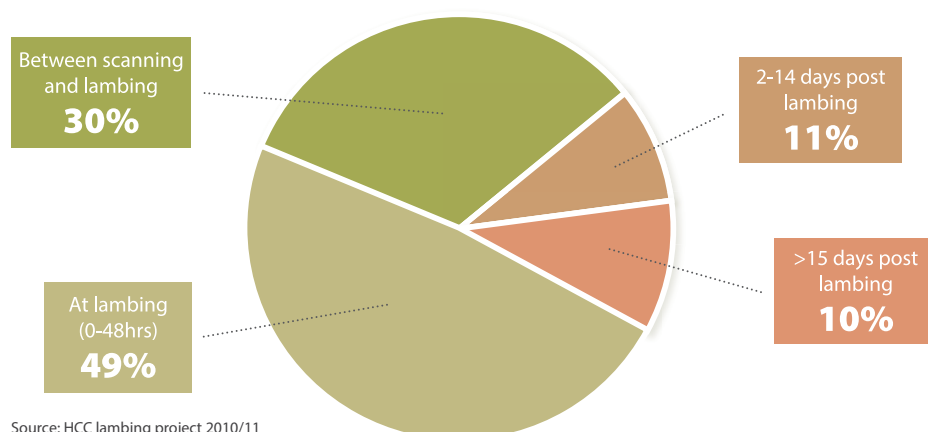


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The first few hours after birth are critical for the survival of the new-born lamb as it leave the warmth of the uterus to face the British weather

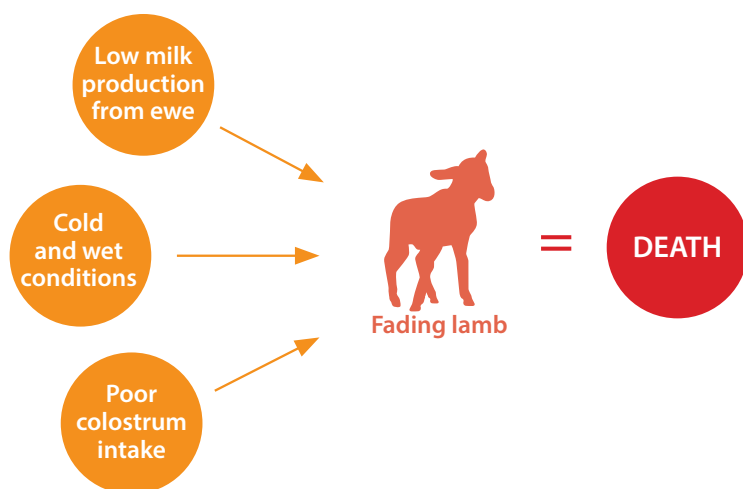
Available carbohydrate is the main factor limiting the length of time that a new-born lamb can resist inclement weather. Hypoglycaemia (low blood glucose) can quickly lead to hypothermia and death and is responsible for the high mortality rate observed during or shortly after periods of bad weather.

The challenges after birth require a lot of energy and lambs have little reserves.

Identifying the early signs of hypoglycaemia and quick intervention will save lives
